Lowe's Heroes Volunteer to Bring Improvement to Playground

Children's Home receives grant to support campus improvement projects

Enterprise, FL - The Florida United Methodist Children's Home (FUMCH) is reaping the benefits from a Lowe's Heroes grant. Living up to its "Never Stop Improving" pledge, more than 10 employees from the Lowe's Orange City and Deltona store volunteered to help clean and spread three hundred bags of mulch throughout the children's playground inside the Independent Living area on FUMCH's Enterprise campus.

Arriving at 9 a.m., the Lowe's volunteers spread over 2 tons of mulch around the 1,500-square-feet playground. The Orange City and Deltona Lowe's stores participate in volunteer projects like this every year as part of an employee volunteer effort known as Lowe's Heroes.

Lowe's Heroes is a company-wide volunteer program that offers its employees the opportunity to support their local community improvement projects. The program has been in effect since the late 1990s and according to company officials, last year alone, Lowe's Heroes were responsible for completing more than 1,300 community and education projects throughout North America. Lowe's contributed more than \$1.3 million in materials to support these projects.
