
Thanks to your generous support, our thrift store, Heart and Home Resale Shop, has successfully completed one year and is now profitable. God is good!

What is a Charitable Gift Annuity?

A charitable gift annuity is a contract between you and the Florida United Methodist Children's Home.

1. You transfer cash or property to us.

2. In exchange, we sign an annuity contract and promise to pay fixed payments to you for life. The payment can be quite high depending on your age, and a portion of each payment may even be tax free.

3. You will receive a charitable income tax deduction for the gift portion of the annuity.

4. You also receive satisfaction knowing you will be helping further our mission.
