Ruth served as the Director of Community Relations and Support Services where Mike simultaneously served as the Director of Facilities at the Madison Youth Ranch

Ruth first joined the Children's Home in 1984, and has served in a variety of roles over during her 34-year tenure. Prior to the Director of Community Relations role at the Ranch, she served in the Development Department on the Enterprise campus, and later as the Executive Assistant to several President/CEO's. In 2013, former President Mr. Michael Galloway selected her to move to the Madison area to cultivate relationships necessary to start the Madison Youth Ranch. Because of Ruth's gracious and warm personality, many friends of the Ranch were made.

Mike joined the Children's Home in 2012, and was the first staff person on site in Madison to guide the preparation and phase one of construction of the Ranch. Since that time, Mike has been the point person on construction projects on that campus, including the new Chapel and Counseling & Support Services Center.

The Board of Trustees, staff and children at both campuses of the Children's Home wish Mike and Ruth well as they open this new chapter in their lives.

Our Residential Care Program provides school-aged children who have been victimized by abuse, abandonment, or neglect with a family-style home environment cared for by loving houseparents, and includes education, counseling, recreation, and ministry opportunities.
