As a part of Day of Service, our children worked in various locations in Volusia and Seminole Counties to help make a difference in the lives of their neighbors. This has become an annual event, in which our children take time to give back to the community. Even with the pandemic-related safety restrictions, we knew there were opportunities to provide needed service and were happy to do so. Our children and their cottage staff split up amongst three churches and a local food bank: relining a church parking lot, painting and organizing, landscaping, and folding/sorting linens at a local food bank. "Faith isn't only an inward and personal experience, but it is also an outward engagement with the world around us," said Rev. Madeline Luzinski, Director of Pastoral Care. "We want our children to have that experience." The event is part of our Spiritual Life department's overarching efforts to teach missions and outreach, and we are excited to see the ways we will continue to do that in the future!

"When I was younger, I was very embarrassed that my mother put my brother and me in the Children's Home. When asked about where we lived, I would always find ways to skirt the question. I was embarrassed and ashamed that I lived in a children's home. To be honest, it wasn't until about 12 years ago that I realized that my time at the Home was probably the best time of my life. It was the only time in my life that I could truly be a kid and not have the responsibility of taking care of my younger brother. It was a time when I felt safe, secure, and loved. Of course, I know why it embarrassed me – because I thought people would think I wasn't worth loving, or that I must have been a really bad kid for my own mother to put us in a Children's Home. However, her putting us there was probably the best thing she could have done for my brother and me. We were surrounded by people who truly cared for us, and it was a time I'll never forget. On multiple occasions, I wish I could go back to."
